The country's shipyards are playing an important role in shipbuilding. Dying government dockyards and shipyards are moving forward as they are handed over to the Navy. Besides, Bangladesh has made remarkable progress in terms of environmental, occupational safety and health in the ship recycling industry, said Industries Minister **Nurul Majid Mahmud Humayun.**

In the speech of the chief guest, the Bangladesh government wants to become a "ship-building nation" from a "ship-buying

nation". The Prime Minister has announced the development of shipbuilding and ship repair industry in Payra port area. If the proposed project is finalised, the Ministry of Industry or BSEC will provide land in the area adjacent to Payra port on behalf of the Bangladesh government and the government will provide all possible support for the establishment of a world-class shipbuilding factory.



A developing country like Bangladesh - not many countries in the world know the amount of business ventures it has, mainly from Marinetech Expo the world will get such information.


































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
